Past Master Highlight Joseph Naper 1852

Joe Naper was a merchant, mill owner, legislator, soldier, shipbuilder and ship captain.

He was born in South Shaftsbury, Vermont in 1798.

He founded the settlement of Naperville in 1831. He opened up a saw mill on the bank of the DuPage River, and later converted it to a grist mill.

The original town plat, which comprised approximately 80 acres, was laid out in the year 1835 by Joe Naper.

He operated a general store located on South Main St. between Jefferson and Jackson on the alley. It is the last building still standing that he erected in Naperville.

He was elected as a Legislator from Cook County in 1836. In 1839 he supervised legislation to carve out DuPage County from Cook County. He served on the same committee with Abraham Lincoln. He was elected again to the legislature in 1852.

He served as a Captain in the Black Hawk War and also fought in the Mexican War in 1847.

In 1848, he, along with six other Freemasons living in the Naperville area petitioned to have a new Lodge formed in Naperville. Thus Euclid Lodge was born. In 1852 he was elected the Naperville Township Supervisor.

He donated the land and stone for the Naperville Academy building .

He was elected the first Village President in 1857.

He was married to Almeda Landon. From this union they had seven children, Robert, Elizabeth, William, Thomas, Mark, Bertha, and Maria. All four of his sons were members of the Lodge.

Charter member of Euclid Chapter No. 13, Royal Arch Masons.

He died in Naperville, August 17, 1862.
