#### Past Master Highlight Lewis Ellsworth 1853

Born July 22, 1805 in Walpole, Cheshire County, New Hampshire.

Married Chloe M. Skinner in December, 1828. They had three children, Eva F., Milton Skinner (PM 1867, 1868), and Lewis Carpenter (also a member of the Lodge).

He moved to Rutland County Vermont in 1823 to learn the tailoring trade. He then engaged in the merchant tailoring business in Troy, New York from 1827 to 1836.

He came to Naperville about 1836 and operated a General Store from 1837 to 1848. He started the DuPage County Nursery in 1850 which was located on the present site of the North Central College Field House and athletic fields.

He was elected the first Probate Judge of DuPage County in 1839, serving for four years.

He served as Naperville Village President in 1876.

He was one of the incorporators of the Union Agricultural Society in Northern Illinois.

He helped found the State Agricultural Society in Springfield in 1853 and served as the President in 1859/1860. He was still a member at the time of his death. He also served as the President of the DuPage County Agricultural Society.

He was appointed by President Lincoln as Collector of Internal Revenue and also served on the Lisle Township Board of Supervisors.

A Charter Member of Euclid Lodge, he also served as Senior Warden in 1851 and Treasurer in 1848 and 1849, and Junior Steward in 1879. He was also a member of Euclid Chapter No. 13, Royal Arch Masons.

Died January 15, 1885 in Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois.

Please take advantage of this growth step an increase your Masonic knowledge. Once you learn a new part vou will have a lot of occasions to use the new skill based on our backlog of degree work.

In addition to learning a new degree part there is also a desper-

ate need for mentors and prompters for our new candidates. We need members who will take an active interest in a new Entered Apprentice or Fellowcraft and work with him to complete his catechism and advance to the next degree, and encourage him to regularly attend Lodge. We need to keep his interest peaked, get him established in the Lodge, get him active in our programs. There is no reason why an EA or FC cannot attend a business meeting as the WM has the option to conduct the business meeting on any of the three degrees.

Euclid Lodge is very good at making Entered Apprentices. However, we are not so good at making Fellowcrafts and Master Masons out of these newly initiated Entered Apprentices. We allow them to lose interest, fall away and become added to our growing list of "Work in Progress" status maintained by the Grand Lodge. Which, by the way is a misnomer, because there is no work in progress taking place with these candidates. In order to correct this situation we need for several members to step up to the plate and give of their time and talents and encourage these unfinished candidates to advance and complete their degree work.

Not only does this provide a valuable service to the Lodge and candidate but it is also of great benefit to yourself. If it has been years since you cracked that ritual book you may find that some of the material seems a little on the foggy side. What a great opportunity for you to do yourself a favor and sharpen your memory work and far more important to help a new candidate become an active Master Mason and Lodge member.

Please contact the WM and volunteer to help your Lodge and yourself.

### Growth of Masonry By Bro. Ralph Gray

In early American Masonry during our colonial days, Masonic Lodges were supplemented with certain ceremonies from British inspiration. These were of historical significance and labeled as "York Rite". Later in some areas the organizations that followed have been called "The American Rite". These ceremonies were evolved from Royal Arch Masons and the Knights Templar.

National organizations were established and in 1798 the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons was chartered. The Knights Templar followed in 1814, and the Grand Council of Royal and Select Masons in 1871. This began the chartering of the three general bodies in most states.

Another stream of supplemental ceremonies and orders evolved from Western Europe, primarily France. They incorrectly became known in America as the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite. Bodies of these continental organizations and degrees were established in 1767 at Albany, New York. Another "Supreme Council" originated in 1801 at Charleston, North Carolina. Today, those two councils are known as the Northern and Southern jurisdictions of the Scottish Rite.

Late in the 1800's there evolved from American Masonry, a need for a more lively and social organization. The Shrine (A.A.O.M.S.) was founded in 1872 and became known as the "play ground of Masonry". The Grotto followed, founded in 1889, with the Tall Cedars of Lebanon in 1902. The Sojourners for Master Masons serving in the Military was formed in 1919 after World War I. Order of the Eastern Star was formed in 1855 followed by the Amaranth in 1873 and shortly thereafter the White Shrine of Jerusalem in 1894.

In 1919, a youth group was organized in Kansas City for boys, Demolay. Soon after organizations were formed for girls also. Jobs Daughters was founded in Omaha, Nebraska in 1920 and the Order of Rainbow Girls was founded in McAlester, Oklahoma in 1922.

It was more recently that the Sovereign York Rite College was established at Detroit, Michigan in 1957. The College provides an overview and assistance to the York Rite bodies in their jurisdictions, confers York Rite degrees and presides at York Rite ceremonies.

#### What is a Mason?

A Mason is a Man and a Brother whose Trust is in God.

He meets you on the Level and acts upon the Square.

Truth is his Compass and he is ever Plumb.

He has a true Grip on all that is Rite.

He is loyal to his Order, and whatever his Degree he is Master of himself.

In the Lodge of life he wears unstained the white Lambskin of innocence.

From his initiation as an Entered Apprentice he travels ever Fast toward the Light of Wisdom until he receives the final - the Divine Password that admits him into the Ineffable Presence of the Eternal Supreme Grand Master of the Universe.
