Past Master Highlight

Daniel Strubler was born September 15, 1837 in Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois, the fourth son of George and Salome Strubler.

He married Mary Kribill July 14, 1859, they had one child who died in infancy.

His occupation was blacksmith, and manufacturer of wagons.

At the age of 17 he apprenticed to the blacksmith trade. In April of 1858 he had his own blacksmith shop with Mr. Samuel Shimp for 1 and

a half years, then another partnership with Joseph Hiltbrand for 3 years, then operated the business alone.

In October, 1866 he was awarded the First Premium by the DuPage County Agricultural and Mechanical Association for horseshoes finished by hammer.

Connected with his shop was a wagon shop, rented to a builder of wagons and carriages.

He also operated an express office and seed business in the store at

212 South Main Street in Naperville.

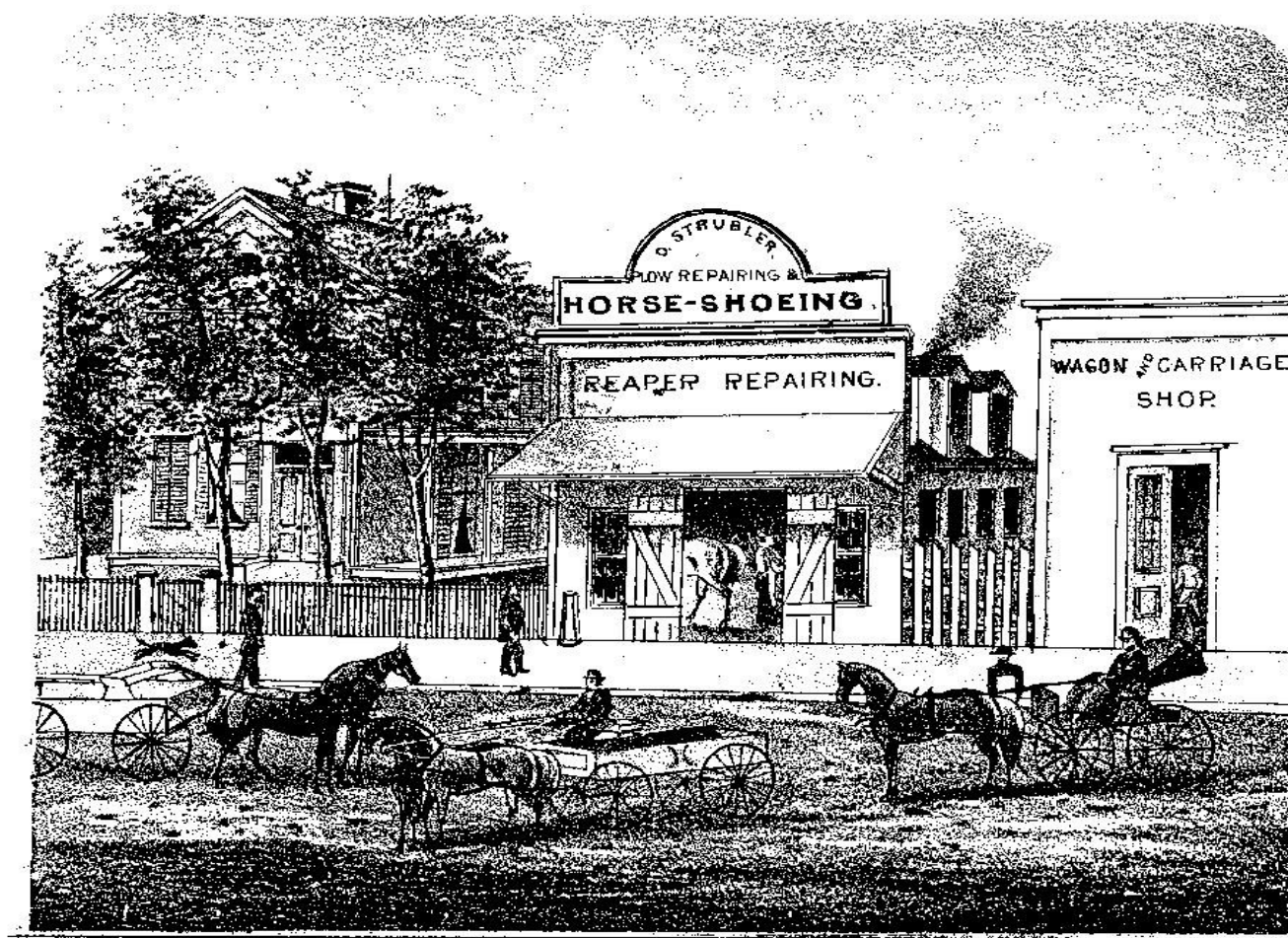
He served Euclid Lodge as Senior Warden in 1877 and 1878, as Junior Warden in 1874 and 1876, as Treasurer in 1883 through 1889, as Senior Deacon in 1871, and as Junior Deacon in 1869.

He died November 29, 1912 in Naperville, DuPage County, Illinois, and was buried in the Naperville cemetery.

The Northeast Corner

Masonic legend and ritual recognize the northeast corner as the proper place for laying the corner-stone in an edifice; symbolically this corner represents the beginning of the laying on the corner-stone of the spiritual superstructure which every true Mason must build. Here, in the Northeast Corner, ceremonies and instructions, the initiate commences the moral and intellectual task of erecting a spiritual temple in his heart. The corner-stone is emblematic of a “well-tried, true and trusty” Masonic character which he begins now to build - the squareness of it surface, emblematic of morality; its cubical form, emblematic of firmness and stability of character; the peculiar finish and fineness of the material, emblematic of virtue and holiness. In consecrated language of symbolism the newly admitted Apprentice is instructed in a life of integrity and stability of conduct, of truthfulness and uprightness of character, and of purity and holiness in all human relations.
