Past Master Highlight Charles Lloyd Calderwood 1972, 1976

CALDERWOOD, Charles Lloyd was born July 22, 1922 in Chicago, Cook County, Illinois the son of William Charles McCallion Calderwood and Edith Kathleen Proctor. He was a veteran of World War II, serving in the U.S. Marine Corps. Lloyd married Harriet Gibson February 25, 1949 in Chicago, Illinois and they were the parents of a son, David Charles. He was employed as a Machinist. He affiliated with Euclid Lodge March 8, 1965 from Lawn Lodge No. 815, Chicago, Illinois and served as Master of the Lodge in 1972 and 1976. He was exalted a Royal Arch Mason May 13, 1989 and served as High Priest of the Chapter in 1992 and 1993. He died December 28, 2011 in Oconomowoc, Waukesha County, Wisconsin and his cremains were buried in the St. John's Episcopal church ash memorial garden, Naperville, Illinois.
